The Award is bestowed upon an ACP Medical Student Member, Associate, Member, Fellow, or Master who has initiated or has been involved in volunteer programs or has provided volunteer service post-training. The service must have been performed on a completely voluntary basis and not for the completion of training or position requirements. Volunteer work must have been done as a physician or medical trainee and be medically related.

Associate and Medical Student Activities

Abstract competition clinical vignettes and research papers prepared by Associates will be presented at the meeting. Winners will receive a cash prize and recognition depending upon placement in the competition. First-place recipients will receive a scholarship to travel to *Internal Medicine 2010* and be eligible for entrance into the national competition.

Winners will receive a cash prize and recognition and be eligible for entrance into the national competition held during *Internal Medicine 2010*. Winners of both competitions will also be acknowledged in the Governor's newsletter and on the chapter Web site.
