Directions

To USU

From Capital Beltway (coming from the west): Take Exit 34, Route 355 South, Wisconsin Avenue toward Bethesda in left lane. Cross Cedar Lane (3rd light). Shortly thereafter turn left into National Naval Medical Center. Follow ACP signs to the meeting.

From Capital Beltway (coming from the east): Take Exit 33, Route 185/Connecticut Avenue southbound toward Chevy Chase/Kensington. Merge onto MD 185 South (Connecticut Avenue) and travel 0.4 miles to Jones Bridge Road. Turn right onto Jones Bridge Road and travel 1.1 miles to Wisconsin Avenue/Rockville Pike. Turn right onto Wisconsin Avenue/Rockville Pike. At first light, turn right into National Naval Medical Center. Follow ACP signs to meeting.

From DC on Connecticut Avenue (coming from the south): Drive north away from DC. Approximately 2 miles north of Chevy Chase Circle, turn right onto Manor Road. At light, turn left onto Jones Bridge Road. Cross Connecticut Avenue and continue to Wisconsin Avenue/Route 355. At first light, turn right into main gate of National Naval Medical Center. Follow ACP signs to meeting.

From DC on Wisconsin Avenue (355) (coming from the south): Drive north on Wisconsin Avenue (355) away from Washington. After crossing Jones Bridge Road, turn right at the main gate entrance to the National Naval Medical Center and follow ACP signs to meeting at USU.

The nearest Metro stop is on the RED LINE at Medical Center. Cross Rockville Pike (355) and enter the main gate following ACP signs to meeting. (There is a significant walk from the gate to the meeting site at USU.)

Parking is available Saturday under the USU building – follow ACP signs.

To Chevy Chase Club
(6100 Connecticut Avenue,
Chevy Chase, MD)

From the north:

Follow the 495 Beltway to Connecticut Avenue (185), Exit 33 South. Immediately south of Bradley Lane, turn right at the stone posts with white light globes on them (6100) to the Chevy Chase Club. Parking is to the left downhill (the closest spaces are for members only).

From the District

Take Connecticut Avenue (185) north past Chevy Chase Circle. The club entrance (with a break in the center divider) is exactly 0.5 miles north of the circle. Turn left into the entrance – look for the stone posts with white light globes on them (6100). Parking is downhill from the club entrance.

From Virginia

Link up with the 495 Beltway North and follow above directions to the Connecticut Avenue exit (33).

Security Note

Due to increased security, attendees are required to have two government-issued photo IDs in order to access the grounds. Please be sure to have your proof of identification available upon arrival at USU. Allow extra time for automobile searches. **NOTE THAT WITHOUT PREREGISTRATION OR MILITARY ID, YOU MAY NOT BE ABLE TO GAIN ADMISSION TO THE BETHESDA NAVAL HOSPITAL GROUNDS AND THEREFORE WILL NOT BE ABLE TO ATTEND THE DC ACP MEETING AT USU.**
