LEARNING OBJECTIVES

1. To be able to differentiate clinically between most Staphylococcal versus Streptococcal soft tissue infections.
 - To know the differential diagnosis of a soft tissue process associated with gas in the tissues, felt as local crepitance or seen as an air density on x-ray.
 - To appreciate the diagnosis, etiology, and management approach of a necrotizing cutaneous process.
 - To know the drugs useful in treatment of Methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus soft tissue infection.
2. To review the current options regarding invasive versus the noninvasive evaluation of ACS.
 - To update new pharmacology in the treatment of ACS.
 - To update the indications for the consideration of precutaneous aortic valves for aortic stenosis.
3. To learn about celiac disease, iceberg effect, and the great masquerader.
 - To learn about the pathogenesis and genetics of celiac disease.
 - To learn how to make the right diagnosis, recognize extra GI manifestations, and also find out long term effects in untreated patients.
 - To learn about the importance of gluten-free diet and future treatment possibilities.
4. To understand an updated view of pathophysiology of type 2 diabetes.
 - To evaluate the impact of recent intensive therapy trials on metabolic targets.
 - To learn about the benefits and risk of Incretin based therapies.
5. To be able to explain the likely reasons Rifaximin works in the treatment and prevention of enteric bacterial infection with only a minimal effect of gut flora.
 - To recite the advantages and disadvantages of known effective treatments of travelers' diarrhea: Rifaximin vs. Ciprofloxacin vs. Azithromycin.
 - To provide current patients groups where Rifaximin prophylaxis should be offered to prevent traveler's diarrhea during travel to developing regions.
6. To utilize updated age-appropriate diagnostic guidelines and therapeutic measures for Dyslipidemia in youth.
