Directions to the Massachusetts Medical Society Headquarters

From Boston: Head west on the Mass. Pike/I-90 to Exit 15. Keep right beyond the toll booth and follow the signs for I-95/128 North. Follow 95/128 North for approximately 2 miles to Exit 27B (Winter Street). Off the exit ramp, keep right, go over 128, and follow Winter Street for approximately 1 mile. See below for further directions.

From Points West: Head east on the Mass. Pike/I-90 to Exit 14. Keep left beyond the toll booth and follow the signs for I-95/128 North. Follow 95/128 North for approximately 2 miles to Exit 27B (Winter Street). Off exit ramp, keep right, go over 128, and follow Winter Street for approximately 1 mile. See below for further directions.

From Points North: Head south on Route 128/I-95 to Exit 27B (Winter Street). Off exit ramp, keep right and follow Winter Street for approximately 1 mile. See below for further directions.

From Points South: Head north on Route 128/I-95 to Exit 27B (Winter Street). Off exit ramp, keep right, go over 128, and follow Winter Street for approximately 1 mile. See below for further directions.

From Winter Street: While you pass the reservoir on your right, the road will curve sharply to the right. Immediately after the curve, you will see a Waltham Woods granite sign on the left. Take a left at the Waltham Woods sign and follow the road up the hill (approx. 1/3 mile). The MMS headquarters building will be directly in front of you. Note that parking and the main entrance are at the back of the building.
