How to Register for ABIM SEP

Obtain credit toward your American Board of Internal Medicine Maintenance of Certification (MOC) on Friday, Nov. 13th, 1:00–5:30 p.m., in San Antonio at the TX ACP annual chapter meeting. TX ACP faculty will present two ABIM Self Evaluation Process Modules, Office-Based Internal Medicine and Hospital-Based Internal Medicine, as pre-courses to the annual chapter meeting. Each SEP module contains 20–25 multiple-choice questions to be completed through group discussion and with the help of an automated audience response system.

Upon completion of the session, attendees will be able to submit their answers to ABIM for scoring and points toward the self-evaluation of knowledge requirement associated with the MOC Program.

Advance registration is required and will be limited to 30 participants.
