The Board of Regents extracted Resolution 2-F23 to discuss. Following discussion, the Board of Regents

155 At their November 4, 2023 meeting, the BOR voted to amend Resolution 2-F23 and adopt for

- 156 implementation led by Marketing and Communications staff. While the BOR recognized the
- 157 importance of the resolution in continuing the work of the College to increase the understanding of
- 158 the impact of administrative burdens, after discussion, the BOR agreed that specifically establishing a
- 159 national preauthorization information day was neither the best strategic nor impactful approach to

achieving the underlying goal of the resolution. They felt that establishing one day would limit rather

161 than further the efforts intended by the resolution. ACP will develop media relations and member

162 engagement strategies to call attention to the problems with prior authorization and advocate to

- 163 modify the prior authorization process as intended by the resolution.
