

Chapter Awards



Learning Objectives

At the conclusion of this activity the learner should be able to:

- 1. Describe the rationale for physician advocacy to benefit patient care.
- 2. Understand how ACP is a leader in advocating at the state and federal levels for legislation that improves patient access and the role of physicians.
- 3. Be familiar with current issues involving the health care system and public health and why physicians should be involved.
- 4. Identify important findings and lessons learned from clinical or academic projects that others could learn from.
- 5. Understand patterns in global migration.
- 6. Identify unique health risks in immigrant populations.
- 7. Develop strategies to address migration-related health risks.
- 8. Evaluate obesity as a chronic disease, and understand the need for long-term management.
- 9. Apply individualized lifestyle treatment for each patient using the SMART framework.
- 10. Understand the pharmacotherapy of obesity and apply the practical aspects of insurance coverage of anti-obesity medications.
- 11. Distinguish sonographic appearances of air, fluid, and the different tissue types.
- 12. Explain the indications and evidence for POCUS as a diagnostic tool.
- 13. Describe the use of POCUS to assist with common bedside procedures, including thoracentesis, paracentesis, arthrocentesis, radial arterial access, and peripheral venous access.
- 14. Discuss practical applications for current guidance on the management of common gastroenterology/ hepatology diagnoses including C diff, nonalcoholic fatty liver disease and colorectal cancer screening.
- 15. What is the Primary provider's role in Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD 3-4-5) management?
