ACP Statements Supporting Science and Expertise

ACP joined other professional organizations to support scientific, data driven decisions, and public health officials during the COVID pandemic.

- On September 27, ACP joined close to 100 other organization representing physicians and other clinicians, public health experts, scientists, patients, and other advocates, urging FDA Commissioner Hahn and Director Marks of the Center for Biologics Evaluation and Research to ensure that a COVID-19 vaccine is only authorized or licensed when it meets the Food and Drug Administration's (FDA's) existing high standards of safety and efficacy. https://www.acponline.org/acp_policy/letters/joint_letter_requesting_cov...

ACP, AAFP Release New Guideline for Treatment of Non-Low Back Pain from Musculoskeletal Injuries in Adults

ACP and the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) have published an <u>evidence-based guideline</u> in *Annals of Internal Medicine*. The guideline provides clinical recommendations based on current best available evidence of the benefits and harms of non-pharmacological and pharmacological management of acute pain from non-low back, musculoskeletal injuries in adults in the outpatient setting, taken in context of costs and patient values and preferences. This guideline does not address non-invasive treatment of low back pain, which is covered by a separate ACP guideline that has also been endorsed by AAFP.
