

2017 C. LOCKARD CONLEY AWARDEE

THOMAS E. FINUCANE, MD, FACP

Professor of Medicine, Johns Hopkins Hospital

Co-Director, Home-Based Medicine, Johns Hopkins Hospital at Bayview

Dr. Thomas Finucane is a Professor of Medicine at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine and Co-Director, Home-Based Medicine at Johns Hopkins Bayview. He graduated from Harvard University and earned his medical school degree at Emory University. He then completed his residency at George Washington University. He is board certified in both internal medicine and geriatrics. He is also a Fellow of the American College of Physicians.

He was Co-Director of the Chronic Disease and Disability clerkship at the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine, where students are taught how to perform physical exams and conduct interviews with patients with chronic co-morbidities and disabilities while remaining cognizant of relevant issues, such as cultural competency and patient beliefs. At the Johns Hopkins Bayview residency program, Dr. Finucane has led many formal didactics and clinical reasoning sessions, served as the attending on the wards, and contributed to discussion at Grand Rounds and other venues. He has also written numerous publications in his outstanding career.

However, the reasons why the residents at Johns Hopkins Bayview nominated Dr. Finucane for the C. Lockard Conley Award was his ability to be the model teacher and mentor with an expertise and willingness to provide guidance which extends far beyond the classroom. Dr. Finucane has contributed tremendously to improving the skills of his residents and students in clinical medicine, patient care and critical reasoning during his last 30 years in practice. As some of the residents commented, "We all know now to always ask the question – why?"
