



Captain Bowes, a native of New York, was commissioned in 1992 through the Health Professional Scholarship Program. He received his Bachelor of Science degree in Neuroscience from the University of Rochester and his Doctor of Medicine from Georgetown University in 1997. He completed Internal Medicine specialty training in 2000 at Naval Medical Center Portsmouth.

Dr. Bowes served his utilization tour at Naval Medical Clinic Quantico and as Senior Medical Officer at Bradley Clinic, Officer Candidate School, Quantico.

In 2001 during his tour at Quantico, he was appointed an Adjunct Associate Professor at Uniformed University School of Health Sciences in Biomedical Informatics and taught "Introduction to Biomedical Informatics" as the first course in the newly founded Biomedical Informatics Department.

In 2002 he reported to Naval Hospital Jacksonville as a Staff Physician. While at Jacksonville, he was Chair of the Credentials Committee and Vice Chair for the Executive Committee of the Medical Staff.

In 2006 he took orders to Navy Medicine East as AHLTA Clinical Champion to initiate implementation and eventually sustainment of AHLTA and other electronic solutions. During this time he served as Chair Primary Care Advisory Board at the Bureau of Medicine and Surgery and served on faculty of the Clinic Management Course for Naval Medicine Personnel Training and Education Command.

CAPT Bowes reported to Naval Hospital Sigonella, Italy in 2009 where he served as the solo Staff Internist. In addition to his primary duty, he was Chair Preferred Provider Network, Special Project Officer Medical Homeport, led the HEDIS and ORYX initiatives and was Director of Medical Services.

In 2012 Dr. Bowes reported to Navy Personnel Command as Non-Surgical Specialties Detailer. He also served as the Medical Director for Navy Personnel Command (PERS-82) overseeing Limited Duty, Temporary Disability Retired and Blood Borne Pathogen programs for the Navy.

In 2014 he reported to Navy Medicine East as Chief Medical Informatics Officer. After arrival he was appointed to oversee Medical Homeport Program as Senior Medical Officer for 18 hospitals and 65 clinics from Texas to Bahrain. In 2016 he was appointed Head, Clinical Programs, Navy Medicine East which included overseeing the Independent Duty Corpsman Program, Virtual Health, and Sexual Assault and Forensics.

From 2017 to 2019 Dr. Bowes served as Director of Medical Services at Naval Medical Center Portsmouth where was responsible 900 staff, 350,000 outpatient, 72,000 Emergency Room visits and 5,000 inpatient admissions per year. He was Chair of Activities Compensation Panel and served as the Medical Corps Chief and was responsible for FITREPs and Career Development for the 500 Medical Corps officers assigned to NMCP and outlying clinics.

Currently CAPT Bowes serves as the Force Surgeon for 112,000 Navy Reserve sailors.

CAPT Bowes is married to Elizabeth, a former Surface Warfare Officer. They have four children; Timothy 22, Julian 20, Lillian 16 and Elias 14. He is board certified and holds Fellow status in the American College of Physicians. CAPT Bowes' personal awards include the Meritorious Service Medal (five awards), Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (two awards), and Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal.
