Marcus Boyd Shook, MD, MACP

MARCH 6, 1933 – DECEMBER 23, 2022

It is with deep sadness that we share the news on the passing of Dr. Boyd Shook on December 23, 2022, at SSM/St Anthony Hospital, one of the places he spent his life providing medical care. Dr. Shook was certainly an integral part of the Oklahoma Chapter of ACP.

Born on a farm in Cogar, Oklahoma in March 1933, he dedicated his life to serving people through medicine. He saw patients up through his final week at Manos Juntas Free Clinic, which he founded in 1995. Dr. Shook practiced internal medicine, hematology, and oncology for over two decades in Oklahoma City, was medical director for Central Oklahoma Medical Group and Chief of Ambulatory Care at Veterans Affairs Medical Center. He was particularly proud of mentoring young healthcare workers at Manos Juntas, at the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, and on care trips to Nicaragua, telling them that in order to understand people they should read more poetry. He was a veteran, serving in the Navy. Among his many awards and honors, he was a Master of the American College of Physicians and had been president of the American Society of Internal Medicine, Oklahoma Foundation for Peer Review, and the Oklahoma County Medical Society. He is survived by his wife Sue.

He was the founder of Fundación Manos Juntas, a free, volunteer run clinic that has provided care to the Oklahoma City community. Under his leadership, the Manos Juntas Clinic provided doctor visits, health screenings, medications, laboratory tests, diagnostic imaging, and vaccinations to the medically underserved for close to 30 years.

At Manos Juntas, we want to continue Dr. Shook's mission of providing access to high-quality healthcare for the medically underserved in Oklahoma. We are dedicated to ensuring that anyone who walks through our doors receives the care and compassion they deserve. Our clinic is a welcoming and inclusive environment for all, irrespective of nationality, race, sexual orientation, or immigration status.

To help with our efforts in honoring Dr. Shook's memory and his dedication to healthcare access, we are announcing the launch of our campaign to raise funds for the Manos Juntas Clinic.
