physician who has been a faithful member of the Chapter and has made major contributions to medicine, particularly in internal medicine.

Brian J. McMahon is a Liver Specialist (Hepatologist) and Senior Clinical and Research Consultant for the Liver Disease & Hepatitis Program of the Alaska Native Medical Center in Anchorage, Alaska. He is a guest researcher for the Arctic Investigations Program of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in Anchorage, an auxiliary professor for the University of Alaska Health Sciences Program, and Clinical Professor of Medicine at the University of Washington.

He has directed the vaccination programs for Alaska Natives that have reduced the rates of acute hepatitis A and B from the highest in the United States to the lowest in the world. He has been active in research in viral hepatitis A, B, and C; hepatocellular carcinoma; and other liver diseases among Alaska Natives/American Indians for over 50 years.

Dr. McMahon is a co-author of the American Association for the Study of Liver Diseases (AASLD) U.S. practice guidance on chronic hepatitis B and was co-chair of the WHO Hepatitis B Guidance Committee.

He was on the Institute of Medicine Committee that published recommendations for hepatitis and liver cancer. He is the author or co-author of more than 180 peer-reviewed papers, 50 book chapters, and numerous review articles and editorials.
