Dear Esteemed CANO Members, from Students to Masters,

It is hard to believe that four years have flown by since I began my term as CANO's Governor. As I write this, we are on the eve of the fifth anniversary of the California's mandatory stay-at-home-order. This is how I began my term, in times of great uncertainty, and now I end with yet again more uncertainties: the future of Medicare, Medicaid and NIH funding, the uptake of vaccinations, and our collective health and security. National ACP has always been at the forefront of advocating for you on these salient health issues and more. CANO recently participated with our sister chapters in Southern California in a virtual Jerry Tilles Sacramento Leadership Week where we spoke with State Legislators on bills that put patients before paperwork, (SB 306 Becker; SB1120 Becker); on women's rights over their healthcare decisions; and expansion of primary care.

In the realm of physician health, we are grateful to Bay Area's Assemblymember Berman, who is also <u>Chair of Business and Professions</u> overseeing the Medical Board of California (MBC), for authoring **AB 2164** which has removed intrusive and stigmatizing health attestation language from our licensing applications. Assemblymember Berman is now authoring a bill, **AB 408**, sponsored by the MBC to establish legislation guiding the activities of a new Physician Health Program that we hope will be a better version of the former "Diversion" program of the MBC.

She has become an incredible physician caring for our most vulnerable populations, delivering substance use disorder and primary care treatment to the unsheltered.
