Electronic posters will be accepted into one of three categories:

(1) Clinical Vignettes - cases that illustrate a rare disease, or an unusual or interesting clinical presentation of an established disease entity

(2) Research – clinical and/or lab research, delineating a new investigation into mechanisms of disease or a detailed review of a clinical problem

(3) Innovation – area quality improvement, safety projects or other areas of innovation in healthcare.

Submission Information: The deadline to submit an electronic poster is 11:59 p.m. PST on Sunday, August 18, 2024. For questions contact Gus Chavez @ <u>SoCalACP1@gmail.com</u>. You will receive an email within 3 weeks after the submission deadline indicating whether your electronic poster has been accepted.

An announcement will be sent out once the online poster submission portal goes live.

- Specifications: A maximum of one poster per first author may be submitted.
- No edits are allowed once the electronic posters are submitted. Please ensure that all errors are corrected before submitting. It is highly recommended that a faculty mentor at your institution reviews your work prior to submission.
- If the first author is not available to present the poster, then a co-author can do so.
