INSTRUCTIONS FOR PARTICIPATION ACP ILLINOIS CHAPTER DOWNSTATE REGION STUDENTS AND RESIDENTS DAY

ORAL CLINICAL VIGNETTE COMPETITION

- 1. Participants must be ACP Illinois Downstate members in good standing.
- 2. Oral Clinical Vignette Abstract may NOT be used for the Poster Presentation Abstract.
- 3. <u>Two</u> residents from each of the three Downstate Illinois Internal Medicine residency programs will be selected by their program to present an **oral clinical vignette**. Presenters must be PGY-2 or PGY-3.
- 4. **ACP Definition:** A clinical vignette is a report of one or more cases that illustrates a new disease entity, or a prominent or unusual clinical feature of an established disease. It may include a summary of pertinent patient history, physical findings, laboratory data, or management description.
- 5. Oral Vignette abstract submissions are due on <u>September 5, 2025.</u> NO LATE ENTRIES. Abstracts must be prepared as directed and submitted to <u>HERE</u>. Abstracts may not exceed 450 words.
- 6. Oral Vignette cases may NOT be presented as posters at the same meeting.
- 7. Vignettes may be <u>up to six minutes</u> in length, and may be followed by up to an additional three minutes for audience questions (total presentation and discussion= 9 minutes). <u>Oral vignettes will be presented October</u> 19th, 2023 in Peoria.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PARTICIPATION ACP ILLINOIS CHAPTER DOWNSTATE REGION

POSTER COMPETITION

- 1. Participants must be ACP Illinois Downstate members in good standing.
- 2. Abstracts are due on <u>August 3, 2025</u>. NO LATE ENTRIES. Abstracts must be prepared as directed and submitted using the online submission link. Abstracts may not exceed 450 words (not including title or authors). You may submit up to 2 abstracts.
- 3. If your abstract is accepted for presentation you will present in-person on October 23, 2025 in Springfield.
- 4. The College's Guide to Preparing for the Abstract Competition, abstract guidelines, and additional abstract resources can be found online https://www.acponline.org/membership/residents/competitions-awards/acp-national-abstract-competition
- 5. Presenters must be medical students or residents in training years 1-3. PGY-4's may display posters if they are in a 4-year dual specialty program (i.e. Med/Peds). Third-year Chiefs may participate.
- 6. Posters must be removed by the presenter.
- 7. Posters may be 24" x 36" (landscape presentation) <u>maximum</u>. Posters larger than 24" x 36" will not be accepted and will be automatically disqualified from the competition.
- 8. ACP IL will provide an easel to present your poster.
- 9. Poster Presenters have two choices for displaying poster:
 - Flexible posters (paper, fabric, etc): Presenters may use a foam board/clips from ACP ILS to post flexible posters.
 - Foam core board posters: Presenter must print poster on rigid foam core board.
- 10. Posters will be numbered and displayed in a designated area. Please hang your poster only in the area designated for your work.

- 12. You must be at your poster during the *Formal Poster Judging* time. If you are not present at your poster to interact with the judges, you will not be eligible for a significant number of points.
- 13. Presenters must be medical students or residents in training years 1-3. PGY-4's may display posters if they are in a 4-year dual specialty program (i.e. Med/Peds). Third-year Chiefs may participate.
- 14. Award presentations will be **October 23, 2025**, at the conclusion of all scheduled events. All presenters are expected to be present for the awards portion of the meeting.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PARTICIPATION ACP DOWNSTATE ILLINOIS RESIDENTS' AND MEDICAL STUDENTS' DAY

DOCTOR'S DILEMMA COMPETITION

- 1. This is a team competition in which medical questions will be presented.
- 2. Each program will be allowed ONE team. Names of team participants are due by BY <u>10:59pm on</u> September 5, 2025 <u>SUBMIT HERE</u>.
- 3. Each team will consist of 3 residents. Team members can come from any resident year.
 - a. Eligibility: Players are eligible to participate in the competition if they are currently residents in an ACGME- or AOA-accredited categorical internal medicine residency training program; preliminary residents in a program and transitional residents in their first year of training are also eligible to participate. Residents in combined internal medicine-pediatrics (Meds-Peds) programs or other ACGME- or AOA-approved combined categorical training programs (i.e. internal medicine-emergency medicine) are also eligible to compete. International internal medicine residents who have completed residency training may participate only if their training concluded within 30 days of competition. Chief residents and fellows in sub-specialty training programs are not eligible to compete.
