ACP Illinois Southern Chapter wins Chapter Excellence Award

I am proud to report that your ACP Illinois Southern Chapter received the Chapter Excellence Award during the IM 2019 annual meeting in Philadelphia. The award recognizes ACP chapters that successfully meet the standards for managing a chapter. The Chapters Subcommittee of the ACP selects the winners. In order to receive the Chapter Excellence Award, chapters must meet 21 criteria of excellence.

ACP honors Quality Improvement Champions from Illinois

Members of our ACP Chapter received honors during a reception for Quality Improvement (QI) Champions at IM 2019 in Philadelphia. The champions were Jennie Hsu-Lumetta, MD, FACP, from Carle Clinic, and Narain Mandhan, MD, FASAM, FACP, medical director at Kirby Medical Center in Monticello.

Dr. Hsu-Lumetta and Dr. Mandhan completed a successful QI project on atrial fibrillation. Their cochampions were Corinne Kohler, MD, FAAFP, of Frances Nelson Health Center in Champaign, and Karen Wiarda, DO, of Carle Heart & Vascular Institute in Mattoon.

ACP Advance provided the downstate IL Atrial Fibrillation champions with training and support to conduct Quality Improvement (QI) projects. The QI goals were to promote identification of risk factors for atrial fibrillation (AF) and use of anticoagulation at 4 healthcare sites in Central Illinois. As a result of QI work, the clinics increased documentation of CHADS-VASc scores in the Electronic Medical Record and increased screening for obstructive sleep apnea and thyroid disease. In addition, ACP and Heart Rhythm Society (HRS) provided a grant to the IL AF champions to conduct 3 AF screening and education events that served more than 300 participants at risk for AF at Carle Clinic in Champaign. The IL AF project in Champaign was one of 5 sites nationwide and was featured in the Heart Rhythm Journal.

Dr. Hsu-Lumetta says that it is possible to make QI into a family event. During an atrial fibrillation screening and education event, Dr. Hsu-Lumetta worked alongside numerous volunteers including her children, Hailey, Lauren, Andrew, and Justin.

Seeking nominations for the Governor-elect

In 2019, your ACP chapter will elect a new governor to serve from May 2021 through April 2025.

A nominating committee will receive and review nominations and then prepare a ballot for the election. The Chair of the Nomination Committee are Janet A. Jokela, MD, MPH, FACP, FIDSA, Susan T. Hingle, MD, MACP, and Jean L. Holley, MD, FACP.

The major duty of the Governor is to represent the members of her/his ACP Chapter. The Governor communicates with members and solicits the opinions of members. Then the Governor conveys the will of the ACP members to the Board of Governors and Board of Regents.

The Governor is responsible for the administrative functions and finances of the ACP Chapter. The Governor performs her/his duties with the advice of the Governor's Advisory Council.

The person who wins the election in 2019 will be called the Governor-elect designee from the date of election until 24 April 2020. Then, the winner of the election becomes the Governor-elect from 25 April 2020 until 30 April 2021. The Governor-elect will become the Governor from 1 May 2021 through April 2025.

ACP for Resident Members


