Faculty

Anne Jacob Carrere, MD

Dr. Carrere received her medical doctorate from the Tulane School of Medicine in New Orleans, Louisiana. She completed internship and residency in internal medicine at Oregon Health & Science University in Portland, Oregon. As a New Orleans native, she returned to Tulane School of Medicine following her residency. Anne practices primary care at Tulane Hospital and at University Medical Center in New Orleans. She participates in both student and resident education. Anne's academic Interests include physician burnout and wellness. She serves on the Wellness Committee at Tulane and is an ACP Wellness Champion for Louisiana.

Vince Cataldo, MD, FACP

Dr. Cataldo is an active member of the American Society of Clinical Oncology, American Society of Hematology and the American College of Physicians-American Board of Internal Medicine. He achieved his MD and completed his residency at LSU School of Medicine in New Orleans. Dr. Cataldo completed a fellowship at MD Anderson Cancer Center and is Board Certified by ABIM in internal medicine, medical oncology and hematology.

Victor Chou, MD

Dr. Chou is the Founder and Medical Director of the Medical Marijuana Clinic of Louisiana, the first medical marijuana specialty clinic in Louisiana. He has provided expert testimony about medical marijuana to the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners. Dr. Chou has been interviewed about medical marijuana by over a dozen media outlets including the Times Picayune, the Advocate, WAFF, NPR, and the Associated Press. He is board certified in Internal Medicine and Pediatrics.

Robert “Bob” Doherty

Mr. Doherty is Senior Vice President of Governmental Affairs and Public Policy for the American College of Physicians (ACP), the largest physician specialty society and second largest medical organization in the United States. ACP represents 154,000 internal medicine physicians and medical student members. Mr. Doherty has more than 40 years of health policy experience and is an accomplished presenter at health conferences. From 1979 to 1998, Mr. Doherty worked in the governmental affairs department of the American Society of Internal Medicine, and with the merger of ASIM and ACP in June, 1998, joined the ACP as Senior Vice President for Governmental Affairs and Public Policy.

Rebekah E. Gee, MD, MPH

Dr. Rebekah Gee is the Secretary of the Louisiana Department of Health, the state's largest agency with a budget of \$14 billion. Her oversight responsibilities include public health and other direct service programs for citizens in need such as behavioral health, developmental disabilities, aging and adult services, emergency preparedness, and the Medicaid program.

Under Dr. Gee's leadership, over 480,000 Louisianans are newly insured under Louisiana's Medicaid Expansion, and for the first time, many are receiving much needed primary and preventive health care. Dr. Gee is an Obstetrician/Gynecologist and brings a caregivers' perspective to the people she serves. She is also a trained policy expert who has served in numerous state and national policy. She is the mother of five energetic children and lives in New Orleans where she continues to see patients.

Nigel Girgrah, MD, PhD

Dr. Girgrah is the Chief Wellness Officer at Ochsner Health System. He is also the Medical Director of the Multi-Organ Transplant Institute at Ochsner Medical Center.

Caley McIntyre, MD

Dr. McIntyre is Vice Chair of Education in the Department of Hospital Medicine at Ochsner Medical Center. He is also their Associate Program Director of the Internal Medicine Residency Program, and Senior Lecturer at the University of Queensland. Dr. McIntyre completed his undergraduate education at the medical school at Northwestern University (Chicago) and his residency, where he was Residency Chief, at Tulane.

Michael Modica, MD

Assistant Professor of Medicine, Section of Hospital Medicine LSUNO Department of Medicine, After receiving his Bachelor of Science degree from Louisiana State University in 2010 and his MD from LSU School of Medicine, Dr. Modica completed his residency in Internal Medicine at LSU School of Medicine and in 2017 and served as Chief Resident from 2017-2018. Dr. Modica is responsible for both bedside education and supervision of residents, interns, medical students, and PA students while on inpatient hospital medicine rotations.

Dr. Morris is an Associate Professor of Medicine in the Section of Gastroenterology and Hepatology in the Department of Medicine at the LSU Health Sciences center in Shreveport.
