LAUREATE AWARD

The Laureate Award honors those Fellows and Masters of the College who have demonstrated by their example and conduct an abiding commitment to excellence in medical care, education or research and in service to their community, their Chapter, and the American College of Physicians.

AWARDEE: PATRICK C. ALGUIRE, MD, MACP

Patrick C. Alguire, MD, MACP is retired, having served as the Editor-in-Chief, Medical Knowledge Self-Assessment Program (MKSAP) for the American College of Physicians.

Dr. Alguire received his medical degree from Michigan State University College of Human Medicine in 1975. He completed a categorical residency in Internal Medicine at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ann Arbor, Michigan, in 1978 and was certified in Internal Medicine in the same year. From 1979 to 1995, he was on the faculty of Michigan State University College of Human Medicine, achieving the rank of Professor and Chief of General Medicine. In 1998, he joined the American College of Physicians (ACP), where he directed the Community-Based Teaching Project. Dr. Alguire was appointed Editor-in-Chief of the Medical Knowledge Self-Assessment Program (MKSAP) for editions 14, 15, 16, and 18. Dr. Alguire was founding editor and Editor-in-Chief for Board Basics, Teaching in Your Office: A Guide to Instructing Medical Students and Residents, Internal Medicine Essentials for Students, MKSAP for Students, MKSAP Digital for Students, Clinical Shorts, and Virtual Dx. From 2010 to 2017, Dr. Alguire was Senior Vice President for Medical Education, overseeing all the educational activities for ACP, the nation's largest medical specialty organization.

Dr. Alguire has been the recipient of many awards, including the Michigan State University College of Human Medicine Excellence in Teaching Students Award in 1980, 1982, 1983, and 1984 and the Excellence in Teaching Residents Award in 1982, 1986, 1990, and 1993. The College of Human Medicine awarded him the Distinguished Clinician Award in 1990 and the Outstanding Alumni Award in 1997. In 2002, Dr. Alguire received the Michigan State University Distinguished Alumni Award. In 2016, he received the Laureate Award from the Pennsylvania Chapter of the American College of Physicians. Dr. Alguire received Mastership of the American College of Physicians (MACP) in 2022.

AWARDEE: REYNARD BOUKNIGHT, MD, PHD, FACP

Reynard Bouknight, MD, PhD, FACP graduated from Howard University, Washington, DC with a BS in Microbiology, and received his PhD in Microbiology and Public Health and his MD from Michigan State University, East Lansing Michigan. Dr. Bouknight completed his Internship and Residency at Case Western Reserve University, Cleveland, Ohio, and is Board Certified in Internal Medicine. He is an American College of Physicians Fellow and a member of the Michigan State Medical Society, Ingham County Medical Society and American Public Health Association.

Dr. Bouknight served as Assistant Professor of Medicine at Case Western Reserve University from 1979 to 1980, Assistant Professor of Medicine at Michigan State University from 1980 to 1985, Assistant Dean/Lansing Campus Michigan State University from 1983 to 2000, Associate Professor of Medicine Michigan State University from 1985 to present (Emeritus 2020), Key Faculty Member Internal Medicine Residency Program Michigan State University from 2006 to 2015, Director Quality Improvement Division Of General Internal Medicine Michigan State University from 2006 to 2015, Medical Director Internal Medicine Clinic from 2012 to 2020 and Chief of the Division of General Internal Medicine Michigan State University from 1997 to 2001 and 2015 to 2020.

Dr. Bouknight has more than 20 television and radio appearances to his credit and has authored more than 50 papers and articles.

AWARDEE: JOHN A. HOPPER, MD, FACP

John A. Hopper, MD, FACP is an Internal Medicine/Pediatric Specialist in Ypsilanti, Michigan and is affiliated with St. Joseph Mercy Hospital. He graduated with Honors from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor with a BS in Molecular Biology, and received his Medical Degree with High Distinction from Wayne State University School of Medicine. Dr Hopper completed his Internship and Residency at the University of North Carolina Hospitals, where he was Co-Chief Resident for the Department of Pediatrics. He is Board Certified in Addiction Medicine, Internal Medicine, and Pediatrics.

Dr. Hopper has served as Assistant Professor with the Departments of Internal Medicine and Pediatrics at Wayne State University from 1994 to 2005, as Assistant Professor with the Departments of Psychiatry and Behavioral Neurosciences at WSU from 1997 to 2005 and as Clinical Associate Professor for the Departments of Internal Medicine, Pediatrics, Psychiatry and Behavioral Neurosciences at WSU from 2006 to 2015. He has been a Clinical Associate Professor, Department of Internal Medicine at the University of Toledo College of Medicine from 2010 to present, as well as Adjunct Physician Instructor, Internal Medicine with the University of Michigan Medical School from 2011 to present. Dr. Hopper has been a Clinical Professor, Departments of Internal Medicine, Pediatrics, Psychiatry and Behavioral Neurosciences at Wayne State University from 2015 to present, Clinical Professor, Department of Internal Medicine at Central Michigan University from 2019 to present, and as Adjunct Professor, Department of Internal Medicine at Georgetown University School of Medicine since August 2022.

Dr. Hopper has received numerous awards including *Best Doctors in America* from 2002 to present. He has also authored numerous articles and presented at more than 100 regional, national and international meetings.

AWARDEE: HEATHER LAIRD-FICK, MD, MPH, FACP

Heather Laird-Fick, MD, MPH, FACP earned a BS from Alma College, MD from Michigan State University, completed her Residency at St. Joseph's Hospital, Ann Arbor, Michigan and her MPH from the University of Michigan. She is a General Internist and Clinical Educator who joined the faculty at Michigan State University in 2001. She has served a variety of administrative and teaching roles, including Assistant Professor, Department of Medicine in the College of Human Medicine, Michigan State University from 2001 to 2007, Associate Professor Department of Medicine, Michigan State University from 2007 to 2019, and Professor, Department of Medicine Michigan State University from 2019 to present. She has also served as Advanced Medicine Clerkship Director, Internal Medicine residency Associate Program Director and Program Director, and most recently Director of Assessment for the college's Shared Discovery Curriculum. Her research interests include assessment of medical learners, competency-based education and training, and cancer in aging populations.

Dr. Misra is Board Certified in Internal Medicine and Nutrition Science.

M. Safwan Badr, MD, MBA, FACP is the Chair of the Wayne State University School of Medicine, Department of Internal Medicine. He is a Professor of Internal Medicine, Physiology and Biomedical Engineering. Dr. Badr is Chief of the Wayne State University Division of Pulmonary, Allergy, Critical Care and Sleep Medicine and a Staff Physician at the John D. Dingell VA Medical Center. He serves as Chief Medical Officer of the Wayne State University Physician Group. He served as the Associate Chair of the Department of

Internal Medicine from 2004 to 2008. Dr. Badr was also the Chief Medical Officer for the Detroit Medical Center from 2008 to 2010.

Dr. Badr graduated from Damascus University Medical School in Syria and completed a Residency in Internal Medicine at Cook County Hospital in Chicago. He completed clinical and research fellowships in Pulmonary, Critical Care and Sleep Medicine at the University of Wisconsin, Madison. Dr. Badr also earned a Master of Business Administration from the University of Tennessee.

Dr. Badr has over 100 publications in peer reviewed journals. He has served on numerous national and international medical societies. He has been a member of the Boards of Directors for the American Thoracic Society and the American Academy of Sleep Medicine; he was the President of AASM from 2013 to 2014. Dr. Badr is a founding member of the American Board of Administrative Medicine.

AWARDEE: JERRY YEE, MD, MACP, FRCP, FASN, FNKF

Jerry Yee, MD, MACP, FRCP, FASN, FNKF is an ABIM Board-certified Nephrologist; Clinical Professor of Medicine, Wayne State University School of Medicine; Chief of the Division of Nephrology and Hypertension, Henry Ford Health System; and Chief Medical Officer, Greenfield Health Systems. Dr. Yee earned a BS degree with highest honors in Premedicine from Pennsylvania State University, and his MD degree from Jefferson Medical College and completed his Residency at Brooke Army Medical Center, Fort Sam Houston, Texas.

Dr. Yee has served as a Major in the United States Army from 1982 to 1989, teaching faculty at Brooke Army Medical Center from 1987 to 1989, Clinical Assistant Professor, Department of Medicine from 1987-1989 and Assistant Professor, Department of Medicine from 1993-1997 at University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio, Associate Professor, Department of Medicine, Case Western University from 1999 to 2005, Clinical Professor, Department of Medicine, Wayne State University from 2007 to 2022, Senior Staff Physician, Department of Medicine, Division of Nephrology, Henry Ford Hospital from 1997 to 2022, where he served initially as Interim Division Head from 2000 to 2001 and Division Head, Department of Medicine, Nephrology and Hypertension, since then.

Dr. Yee has received more than 40 honors and awards throughout his career, been cited in more than 200 publications, posted more than 140 Abstracts, been involved with numerous patents and copyrights, and has made more than 100 presentations at National and International meetings.

Dr. Yee passed away in June 2022 and this award is being given posthumously.

AWARDEE: VED GOSSAIN, MD, FRCP®, MACP, FACE

Ved Gossain, MD, FRCP®, MACP, FACE is the emeritus Swartz Professor of Medicine and former Chief of the Division of Endocrinology and Metabolism, at Michigan State University (MSU). He continues to teach, serving his patients and carrying out research. He served as Chief of the Division of Endocrinology from 1996-2015. He established the Endocrinology Fellowship Program at MSU and served as the Program Director since its inception in 2006 to 2013. Dr. Gossain has been an active Clinical Researcher and has published over 80 original papers and several book chapters. He has co-edited a book on "drugs in diabetes" and has recently authored a book entitled, *My Journey Through the United States 8 Dollars and No dream.*

He has been elected to Alpha Omega Alpha Honor Society and fellowships of Royal College of Physicians of Canada (FRCP©), American Association of Clinical Endocrinologists, (FACE) and All India Institute of Diabetes. He was awarded Mastership in the American College of Physicians (MACP) in 2014. He has received numerous honors and awards including Presidential Citation (Ingham county 1999), Laureate Award (American College of Physicians Michigan Chapter 2004), Distinguished Faculty Award (College of Human Medicine, MSU 2006), Professor Vishwanathan Oration Award (Research Society for Study of Diabetes in India 2000). Academic Excellence Award (Michigan Association of Physicians of Indian Origin 2009), Distinguished Alumnus Award (Amritsar Medical and Dental Association of North America 2010) and he has been listed among the *Best Doctors in America* for the last several years.

Dr. Gossain received his basic medical degree (MBBS) from Medical College Amritsar and subsequently obtained a post-doctoral degree in General Medicine (MD) from All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi, India. He completed an Internal Medicine Residency at the Springfield Hospital Medical Center (now Bay State Medical Center) in Springfield, Massachusetts; an Endocrinology Fellowship at the University of Cincinnati, Ohio; and an additional year of Endocrinology Research Fellowship at the Medical College of Wisconsin in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

Dr. Gossain's research interests include endocrinology and metabolism, specifically diabetes, obesity, thyroid, and growth hormone disorders.
