Laureate Award

Benjamin J. Diaczok, MD, FACP



Dr. Diaczok is a native of southeast Michigan. He graduated Fitzgerald High School in 1977; received a BS Hon degree and MD degree from Wayne State University; and completed his Internal Medicine residency and fourth year Chief Resident year at Henry Ford Hospital. He served as an attending physician at St. John Hospital; Associate Program Director at Providence Hospital and Program Director at St. Joseph Mercy Oakland. Presently he is Medical Director of the SJMO Internal Medicine Resident clinic. He has received teaching awards at both Providence Hospital and St. Joseph Mercy Oakland.

Dr. Diaczok has been an active member of the American College of Physician for over 30 years. He has chaired the ACP Michigan Chapter State Scientific program five years, hosted several Associates Day meetings, judged research for over 25 years, presented lectures and moderated medical update sessions and has chaired or served on multiple committees. In 2003 Dr. Diaczok was awarded fellowship in the American College of Physicians. In 2004 he received the Governor's Award.

Dr. Diaczok's research interests include diabetes, lipid disorders and hypertension. Present research includes work on health care disparities. He has presented over 100 abstracts, published a dozen articles in peer-reviewed journals and has lectured widely.

On a personal note, Dr. Diaczok has been married 32 years and has three children. The oldest two, both boys, are Eagle Scouts. Dr. Diaczok has accompanied the troop to both Phillmont and Sea Base camps. His wife and daughter are Registered Nurses and his middle son is a medical student. Dr. Diaczok is a member of the Franklin Community Church Choir and an avid amateur astronomer.



Laureate Award

Joseph C. Kolars, MD, MACP

Joseph C. Kolars is the Josiah Macy, Jr., Professor of Health Sciences Education and Senior Associate Dean for Education and Global Initiatives at the University of Michigan Medical School (UM). He oversees medical student, graduate, resident/fellow, and post-doctoral education as well as continuing professional development/CME. A recipient of the 2019 Abraham Flexner Award for Distinguished Service to Medical Education from the American Association of Medical Colleges (AAMC), he has also served as Program Director Internal Medicine Residency and fellowship programs at UM and at Mayo Clinic.

He was one of the early adopters of the Accreditation Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) outcomes initiative and played an important leadership role in their Education Innovations Program. His team at the UM is one of the leading schools in the American Medical Association (AMA) Transforming Medical Education initiative that is dramatically changing the way learners develop so as to be more impactful partners on the improvements necessary for our U.S. healthcare system. Global health and strengthening education systems in low-resource settings has been a major focus of his career.

In addition to serving on the Fogarty International Center Advisory Council, he has been extensively involved with the NIH Medical Education Partnership Initiative (MEPI). He is on the Board of the Consortium of Universities for Global Health (CUGH). Since 2010, he has been the co-director for the Joint Institute for Translational and Clinical Research with Peking University of Health Sciences. This past year the University of Michigan established a new Center for Global Health Equity where Dr. Kolars plays a strategic leadership role.

A practicing gastroenterologist, he obtained his MD degree in 1982 from the University of Minnesota Medical School and completed his post-graduate training at the University of Michigan.

Elizabeth Bankstahl, MD, FACP

Dr. Elizabeth Bankstahl earned her medical degree from Wayne State University in 2008. She then completed her Internal Medicine residency at St. John Hospital. She became chief resident in 2011, and afterwards joined the core teaching faculty there, where she still currently practices.

Dr. Bankstahl has been actively involved with medical students and residents since residency. She was co-site director for St. George University medical students and site director for Central Michigan University medical students, until she accepted her role as medical director for the Internal Medicine outpatient clinics in June 2019.

She has completed the Stanford Development Clinical Teaching Facilitator training program in 2015, and she continues to teach this to local doctors and residents in her facility. Dr. Bankstahl also loves to teach high value care in her program.

On a community basis, Dr. Bankstahl is involved on a national level with Ascension on improving glycemic control and care of diabetic patients in Michigan. She also is vice chair of Ascension Physician Council of southeast Michigan and the Internal Medicine representative of Ascension St. John Medical Executive committee.

Dr. Bankstahl participated in the ACP Physician leadership program and received her certificate in physician leadership for primary care in January 2020. Her capstone research project on "Does Sex-Specific Guideline Adherence Depend on Sex of Physician" won for the ACP Early Career Physician, and she presented it virtually at the National ACP meeting in April 2020.

Allison Ruff, MD, FACP

Dr. Ruff is a Clinical Assistant Professor in the Department of Internal Medicine, Division of General Medicine at the University of Michigan. Originally from Florida, Dr. Ruff completed her undergraduate studies at the University of Florida, medical school at the University of Miami, and Internal Medicine Residency as well as chief residency at the Cleveland Clinic Foundation in Cleveland, Ohio. There she met her husband and began her family which now includes 3 children ages 5 and under.

Her clinical practice includes primary care for adult patients at Michigan Medicine with a focus on the care of medically complex adults and women's health. Dr. Ruff is involved in medical student education at the University of Michigan, teaching in the Doctoring course, as well as directing the Patients and Populations Branch. She is one of ACP's Wellness Champions for the state of Michigan and the Chair of the Michigan Chapter's Early Career Physicians Committee.



Internist Most Committed to Independent Practice Award

Jason Batke, MD, FACP

Dr. Batke became interested in medicine while growing up in the Metro Detroit area and studied at Wayne State University for undergraduate and medical school. He completed his internal medicine residency at William Beaumont Hospital and has remained on the medical staff since completing his training.

Dr. Batke has been engaged in teaching at Beaumont for more than 20 years, starting as a Chief Medical Resident and continuing to this time. He is collaborative in his professional activities as he works as a private hospitalist. In addition to participating in the education of students and residents at the hospital, he serves as an elected representative to the medical staff. He advocates for and shares the concerns of the medical staff – both private and employed.

He has been a member of the council for the American College of Physicians and has served as a judge of resident and student abstracts at both the regional and resident day meetings. He has also served on the board of the local chapter of the Society of Hospital Medicine. The Michigan Chapter is pleased to recognize Dr. Batke this year with this award.



Volunteerism & Community Service Award

Joseph Skoney, MD, FACP

After Dr. Skoney graduated from Wayne State University School of Medicine in 1985, he completed an internal medicine residency at William Beaumont Hospital. Upon completing his residency in 1988 he served as chief resident. Dr. Skoney joined Troy Internal Medicine in 1989 and has had numerous internal medicine residents, medical students, and pre-medical students do rotations with him in his clinic. He currently serves as compliance officer for Arcturus. Dr. Skoney has also served as an ACP poster judge for several years.

Dr. Skoney has been going on yearly mission trips to Magori, Kenya (Magori means mosquito in Swahili), with a medical mission group Kenyarelieff.org. During the time he is there, he will see about 50 patients a day (no electronic medical records), one third of them being HIV positive. During the week he is there, he becomes their pediatrician, gynecologist, orthopedist, ID doctor (lots of Malaria) and every other specialty that is not ophthalmology as he goes with a team of ophthalmologists that performs cataract surgery.

Dr. Skoney is also active in his church community as he is a sacristan at 6:10am Tuesday mass and 8:00am Sunday mass, as well as being a Eucharistic minister. He was one of the co-chairs for the Vocation Committee and helped coordinate pancake breakfasts, movies and lectures. He also was a co-writer for the Chastity Page in his church newsletter.

Dr. Skoney currently serves on the board of directors for Oakland County Medical Society.



Great Internist of Michigan Award

H. Gunner Deery II, MD

H. Gunner Deery II, MD is an Infectious Diseases specialist and the former Hospital Epidemiologist at McLaren Northern Michigan Hospital and Consulting Hospital Epidemiologist at Alpena Regional Hospital in Alpena, Michigan. He is the past Medical Director of the McLaren Northern Michigan Hospital Wound and Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy Clinic. He is the President of *IDwisdom*, an infectious diseases, health care epidemiology and business consulting service. He currently does infectious diseases consultations by telemedicine at rural Michigan hospitals.

After earning his Bachelor of Science from the University of Illinois and a Master of Science in Immunogenetics from Northern Illinois University, Dr. Deery was awarded his medical degree from Rush Medical College. He served as a Postgraduate Physician in Internal Medicine for 3 years at the University of Southern California Medical Center and the University of Michigan. He completed a 2-year Research Fellowship in Infectious Diseases at the University of Michigan Medical Center.

Dr. Deery has served on numerous state and national committees. His research activities span more than 3 decades and encompass a broad range of issues in infectious diseases. He has published numerous abstracts and has authored or co-authored several journal articles and book chapters.

In addition to being Board Certified in Internal Medicine and the subspecialty, Infectious Diseases, Dr. Deery is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians, the Infectious Diseases Society of America, and the Society of Hospital Epidemiology of America. He has been named one of the “Best Doctors in America” from 1998 through 2020. In 2001, Dr. Deery was the recipient of The Clinician Award of the Infectious Diseases Society of America. In 2003, he was awarded the Laureate Award by the Michigan Chapter of American College of Physicians. In 2014, patients, colleagues, family and friends honored him by the establishment and funding of the Hugh Gunner Deery II, MD Education and Patient Care Endowment Fund via the McLaren Northern Michigan Foundation. He is the 2015 recipient of the Michigan Infectious Diseases Society “The Society Citation” award. In 2020 he was awarded the McLaren Northern Michigan Foundation “Jack Clark Philanthropy and Service Award”.



Lifetime Achievement Award

Robert Bloom, MD, FACP

Dr. Robert Bloom was born at Sinai Hospital of Detroit, the same institution where he did his residency and eventually became Internal Medicine Program Director and Chief of Hematology and Medical Oncology. When asked how long he had been there, he would state his age and then add, "off and on". Along the way, he attended Wayne State University School of Medicine and completed a fellowship in Hematology and Medical Oncology at the University of Rochester, Strong Memorial Hospital. Dr. Bloom returned to Sinai Hospital in 1984 to join his mentor and former Governor of the Michigan ACP Dr. Arnold Axelrod on the faculty. He was Program Director for 12 years before moving to Providence Hospital where he was the Hematology/Oncology Associate Program Director until August of 2011 when he again became the Internal Medicine Program Director. Despite his move and new responsibilities, he has continued until recently to be the principal educator of the residents of Sinai/Grace Hospital in hematology and oncology, all of whom rotated through his clinical office.

He was previously on the faculty of Wayne State University School of Medicine but is currently an Associate Professor of Medicine at the Michigan State University College of Human Medicine.

Dr. Bloom is active in the American College of Physicians, the American Society of Clinical Oncology, and the Association of Program Directors in Internal Medicine. He was an early advocate of the National In-service examination and wrote questions for the test.

Dr. Bloom says that he is most proud of the almost 280 Internists that he has trained, as well as over a 1,000 fellows, residents, and students whom he has had the honor to instruct over the past 35 years.

The Michigan Chapter of the American College of Physicians is pleased to recognize Dr. Bloom with the Lifetime Achievement Award.
