The top poster winner receives an award to attend and present at the National ACP meeting being held April 15th to 17th, 2027 in Los Angeles. The prior ACP NH Chapter top poster also won recognition at the 2025 national meeting!

Please submit your abstract online at <https://webforms.acponline.org/form/new-hampshire-abstract-form> [webforms.acponline.org] **NO LATER than 5 PM Tuesday, September 8th**. It is a requisite for the first author to register as an ACP member to submit an abstract. Residents should reach out to their program coordinators, chiefs or faculty and Geisel students to their Internal Medicine Interest Group co-leaders, Aidan Tice-Raskin or Demetrios G. Garbis if they have questions about registering with ACP.

A current **requirement** is that you **MUST** be paired with a faculty mentor who can help guide you on both the abstract and the poster. It is **NOT** a requirement that your mentor be an ACP Member.

[National Abstract Competition | ACP](#) describes the types of abstracts and access to recent podium winners and finalists. The abstract judges will consider content (relevance to internal medicine, originality, significance, well-reasoned) and format (clearly written, free of grammatical errors, manner of presentation, validity) when determining which abstracts go on to the poster competition. Judge's decision will be E-mailed September 22nd.

Electronic versions of the poster should be ready for review by the judges by 5pm Tuesday October 6th. Poster presenters must register for the ACP NH chapter meeting [2026 New Hampshire Chapter Annual Scientific Meeting | ACP Online](#) and present their poster in person to qualify for the top three prizes and podium presentation.
