INSTRUCTIONS FOR PARTICIPATION

POSTER & ORAL CLINICAL VIGNETTE COMPETITION

- 1. First author and presenter must be a current ACP Resident/Fellow or Medical Student member.
- 2. Only one submission per first author is allowed per category, but there is no limit to the number of co-authorships.
- 3. Resident Members may submit abstracts for either oral or poster presentation. Abstracts not selected for the oral presentation will automatically be placed in the poster abstract competition.
- 4. Abstracts submitted by Medical Students are eligible for poster presentation only.
- 5. Abstracts are due on **September 15, 2023. NO LATE ENTRIES will be accepted**. Abstracts must be submitted via the online abstract submission form on the Chapter website. Abstracts are limited to 450 words not including title or authors and citations. References/Citation is not required for abstracts.
- 6. **First authors are expected to be present by their poster for their entire judging period**. Failure to be present for judging will result in immediate disqualification from the competition.
- 7. Posters specifications (size, print, etc.) will be sent to competitors when accepted poster emails.
- 8. Abstracts will be accepted into one of five categories as per <u>national ACP guidelines</u>. Abstracts submitted to the incorrect category will be ineligible for presentation.
- Clinical Vignette (reports of one or more cases that illustrate a rare disease entity or an unusual clinical presentation of an established disease),
- OTHER Category:
- **Basic Research** (clinical and/or laboratory research, delineating a new investigation into mechanisms of disease or consisting of a detailed review of a clinical problem),
- Clinical Research (mechanisms of human disease; therapeutic interventions; clinical trials; development of new technologies; analysis of existing datasets; epidemiological and behavioral studies; outcomes research and health services research),
- Quality Improvement/Patient Safety (a project in progress or completed project with results), or
- Wellbeing/Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion
- **High Value Cost-Conscious Care** (projects that focus on reducing waste in the system, minimizing harms, or improving patient care through communication).

We highly encourage submitting early to ensure your abstract is received. You will receive a confirmation email notification once your abstract has been successfully received, so please use your school/hospital affiliated email address. All communication regarding the abstract competition will be sent electronically.

If your abstract is accepted for poster presentation:

- No submissions will be considered after the deadline.
- Presenters selected for the competition will be notified by September 26th.

- Authors are required to be a member and register for the New Mexico Chapter Scientific Meeting. The meeting brochure and registration link are available on the Chapter Web site. There is no charge for Residents or Medical Students to attend the meeting. Nonmember Residents and Medical Students may apply for membership online.
- First authors should plan to set up posters from 8:00am-9:00am on Saturday, November 11th and plan to be present for the entire day in Santa Fe.
- Authors whose posters are selected for the juried poster competition should plan to answer questions about their poster from 10:30am-11:30am.
- One easel will be provided as well as poster board measuring 30" x 40" with a 1/4" thickness.
- Oral vignettes will be presented from 12:00-1:30 p.m.
