Criteria include such activities as holding a volunteerism/community service activity, participation in advocacy activities, holding numerous stand-alone meetings, having revenue sources outside of dues and meeting registration fees, implementing a strategic plan, implementing a formal recruitment and retention plan, measuring outcomes, and conducting various activities for Medical Students, Residents, and Early Career Physicians.

#### A Reminder to Vote in the Ohio Governor Election

#### **Election Opened September 26, 2025**

A reminder to vote for our next Chapter Governor! The Governor serves as the official representative of the College for the chapter, providing a link between members at the local level and leadership at the national level.

This year we have two superb candidates running for Governor-elect, Ellen J. Gelles and Glen D. Solomon. I want to acknowledge and thank them both for their enthusiastic and dedicated work on behalf of our Chapter.

The election ends November 7, 2025. <u>Members can vote online</u>. The ballot includes your ACP Member Number and unique Election Passcode that is required to cast a vote. Please note the following to ensure a smooth voting process:

- Eligible voters are MACPs, FACPs, Members, and Resident/Fellow Members with an election date of 9/1/2023 or earlier.
- ACP partners with Survey & Ballot Systems (SBS) to conduct the election.
  - You may need to check the spam/junk folder for your ballot materials
- The subject of the ballot email will be "Vote Now! ACP 2025 Governor-elect Election Voting Information."
- The sender will be Julie Sinkoff, Coordinator BOG Relations
- Ballots were sent electronically around September 26, 2025.
