Point of care ultrasonography (POCUS) is intended to answer focused clinical questions at the bedside and guide patient management. Over the past several years, it has evolved as a valuable adjunct to physical examination. However, training opportunities in diagnostic POCUS remain sparse at this time, especially for practicing physicians and advanced practice providers. Through this course, we intend to introduce the attendees to some high yield POCUS applications and provide hands-on experience so that they gain confidence to start scanning at their respective institutions. One-on-one mentored hands-on POCUS experiences are the only way to learn both the psychomotor and the cognitive pattern-recognition aspects of ultrasound. The course will be split roughly 50/50 between didactics and hands-on experiences.
