End Domestic Abuse Wisconsin (End Abuse) was founded in 1978 as the Wisconsin Coalition Against Woman Abuse by local domestic violence programs across Wisconsin. At the time, advocates recognized the need for a coordinated statewide organization to lead legislative advocacy on domestic abuse issues and provide technical assistance and support to emerging local programs responding to violence against women.

Since its inception, End Abuse has served as a central hub and trusted resource for domestic violence victims and survivors, direct service advocates, and professionals across health care, social services, law enforcement, and the criminal justice system. Our organization plays a unique role in Wisconsin's domestic violence response system as the "supporters of the supporters," ensuring that local programs have the training, resources, and technical assistance needed to effectively serve survivors in their communities.

End Abuse strengthens the statewide network by building capacity, advancing policy change, and supporting coordinated systems responses. Wisconsin now has a robust network of domestic violence programs providing shelter, advocacy, and critical services to survivors and their children. End Abuse enhances the effectiveness of this network by ensuring providers are equipped to navigate complex systems, respond to evolving needs, and advocate for systemic change.

In addition to our training and technical assistance work End Abuse also houses three additional distinct initiatives:

Dare2Know (D2K):

our statewide prevention initiative working to stop violence before it begins by engaging youth in valuing their voice, persuading their peers, and connecting with their community. The first of its kind in our state, it is a challenge and a movement for teens and adult mentors to rally around healthy relationships.

RISE Law Center: Wisconsin's only culturally-specific law firm focusing on issues facing immigrant survivors.

National Clearinghouse on Abuse in Later Life (NCALL): End Abuse's national project, providing training and technical assistance to programs nationally on elder abuse, abuse in later life and elder justice.

Across Wisconsin, End Abuse provides life-saving programs, training, public policy advocacy, and leadership development that elevate the voices of survivors, advocates, and community members. By fostering safety, dignity, and opportunity, we help create conditions in which individuals, families, and communities can thrive.
