



Meeting Information

Resident/Fellow Members' Activities

Clinical vignettes, quality improvement projects, and research prepared by Resident/Fellow Members will be presented at the meeting. Resident winners are eligible for entrance into the national competition during Internal Medicine 2020 in Los Angeles, California.

Original clinical vignettes, performance improvement (PI), and research projects are eligible. Most of the work is expected to have been completed by the associate. Faculty mentors are strongly encouraged to assist with literature review, editing, and proofreading, but not rewriting the entire abstract. Clinical vignettes, PI, and research that have been submitted and/or presented at local or other regional meetings (e.g., a state ACP chapter meeting) remain eligible, provided that they did not win an award at the regional level (any local/ hospital-level award remains eligible). Clinical vignettes, PI, and research that have been presented at a national meeting (national ACP or subspecialty meetings) are ineligible. Clinical vignettes, PI, and research that have been published are ineligible, except for those published only in a hospitallevel publication. Publication clearance is the responsibility of the submitter.

For Residents: The first call for abstracts for the 2019 Army/ Air Force ACP Conference went out to program directors and their affiliated staff in mid-March 2019. As in years past, this competition will have 3 categories: Research, Quality Improvement, and Clinical Vignette. Also, consistent with guidelines last year, we are asking that the program leadership at each institution collect abstract submissions for their respective residents and select the top abstract in each of these 3 categories. Please then submit these 3 abstracts to the following e-mail address: Army.airforce.acp.abstracts@gmail. com. The remaining abstracts from your residents will then be eligible for submission for presentation at a subspecialty breakout session (more details regarding this process will come at a later date). Please ensure that you designate to which category the abstract will be submitted. Each abstract is limited to 450 words (not including title and authors). The final deadline for submission is COB Tuesday, June 3, 2019.
