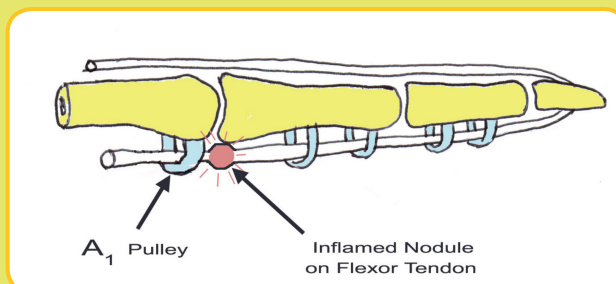
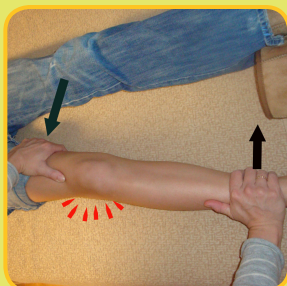

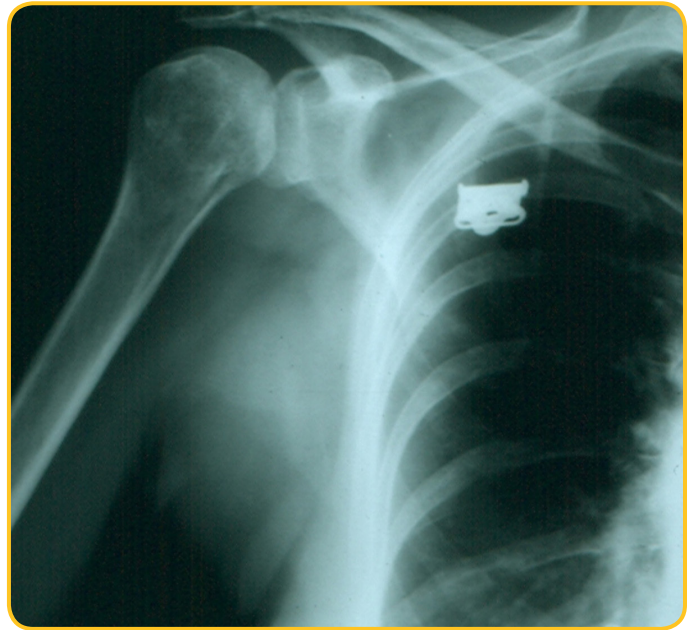

Edward (Ted) Parks, MD, Professor of Medicine, Department of Medicine, University of Colorado School of Medicine, Orthopedic Surgeon, Western Orthopedics, PC, Denver, Colorado

Ted Parks is an orthopedic surgeon who has spent the past 20 years collaborating with the ACP and the Internal Medicine department at the University of Colorado to develop a curriculum centered around teaching orthopedics to primary care providers. He is an annual speaker at the regional and national level for the ACP and has won numerous teaching awards. For over 15 years, he has been selected by the University of Colorado Internal Medicine department to teach the internal medicine residents during their 1-month orthopedics rotation. He has been awarded “Best Doctor” by *U.S. News and World Report* and “Top Doctor” 15 years in a row by *Denver’s 5280* magazine. Dr. Parks graduated from Stanford with a BS and MS, then got his medical degree at Yale. He went on to do his residency at UCLA and did a 1-year fellowship in sports medicine with Dr. Frank Noyes in Cincinnati.
