Faculty

Michael Wagner, MD, FACP, RDMS, Assistant Professor of Medicine, University of South Carolina School of Medicine in Columbia, SC

Dr. Wagner is the Director of Internal Medicine Ultrasound Education for the residency program and 3rd-year clerkship, as well as the Assistant Director of Physical Diagnosis for the undergraduate curriculum.

Jessica McFarlin, MD, Assistant Professor of Neurology, Chief of Palliative and Supportive Care, University of Kentucky

Dr. McFarlin received her medical degree from the University of Kentucky and then completed her residency and dual fellowship training at Duke University Medical Center in Durham, NC. She is board certified in Neurology and Hospice and Palliative Medicine as well as Neuro Critical Care. Her primary research focus is in communication training of physicians and in delivering high-quality palliative care in patients in the intensive care setting.

Cecil E. Peppiatt, MD, Assistant Professor of Medicine, Palliative Care, University of Kentucky

Dr. Peppiatt earned an MD from the Medical College of Georgia (now Augusta University) in Augusta, Georgia. He completed residency at the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine. He is certified by the American Board of Internal Medicine and the American Board of Hospice and Palliative Medicine. He is the Assistant Professor of Medicine at the University of Kentucky College of Medicine in Lexington.

Daniela Moga, MD, Associate Professor of Pharmacy Practice and Science, University of Kentucky

Dr. Moga is also affiliated with the Institute for Pharmaceutical Outcomes & Policy and Sanders–Brown Center on Aging. Dr. Moga's research interests include geriatric pharmacoepidemiology and health outcomes research with a focus on evaluating health effects associated with polypharmacy and use of potentially inappropriate medications in older adults with multiple comorbid conditions. Dr. Moga is currently the primary investigator for a large study, "Intervention for Cognitive Reserve Enhancement in delaying the onset of Alzheimer's Symptomatic Expression: The INCREASE study," which is investigating cognitive effects of deprescribing inappropriate medications and treatment optimization in older adults.
