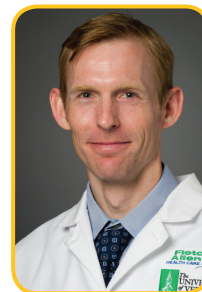

The authors of selected abstracts will be invited to present as a poster at the ACP Vermont Chapter meeting, where judges will choose a winning poster in each category. The winners will receive recognition and support to present at the national ACP Internal Medicine Meeting in Los Angeles, California, from April 23 to 25, 2020.

The deadline to submit an abstract is September 1, 2019.
