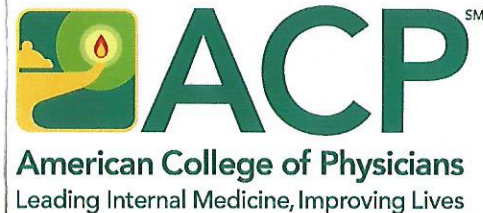

Dr. Corman is a graduate of The
Woman's Medical College of
Pennsylvania (class of 1970), now the
Drexel University College of Medicine.
She completed her internship and

residency in internal medicine and one year fellowship in
infectious diseases at The Medical College of Pennsylvania. She
then joined the University of Missouri, Columbia for a fellowship
in rheumatology where she later served on the faculty. At the
University of California Davis, she was Chief of the General
Internal Medicine Division and IM clerkship director. In 1979,
she joined the faculty at the University of Florida College of
Medicine in the Divisions of General Internal Medicine and
Rheumatology, where she served for 15 years. There, she was
Director of the Internal Medicine Resident Clinic and the
Internal Medicine Residents' Clinic. In 1995, she was recruited
as Vice Chair for Education and Training Program Director to the
University of Louisville.

Since 1999, she has been Professor and Regional Chair of the
Division of Internal Medicine at the Huntsville campus of UAB.
In 2012, the Huntsville Regional Campus and Huntsville Hospital
were approved for a new Internal Medicine Residency Program,
which is now fully staffed with eight residents per each of three
years.

Dr. Corman is a dedicated clinician educator who has co-edited
several issues of the Medical Clinics of North America on a
diverse range of topics, including "Medical Evaluation of the
Preoperative Patient," "Clinical Immunology," and "Nutrition."
She edited Rheumatology for the House Officer, and published
early reports on the association of Parvovirus with rheumatic
diseases.

She has received multiple teaching awards starting with the
Golden Apple award as Chief Resident at MCP, the prestigious
Hippocratic award at the University of Florida in 1994, and
several Argus and Best Attending awards from UAB students
since joining the UAB faculty in 1999.

Dr. Corman's late husband, Dr. Norman Ackerman, was a
veterinary radiologist. Their daughter Tiffany is an artist, and
their son Anthony loves dogs and his career. Both live in
Louisville, KY.

Dr. Corman loves reading mysteries and history, learning about
medicine and science, and teaching.
