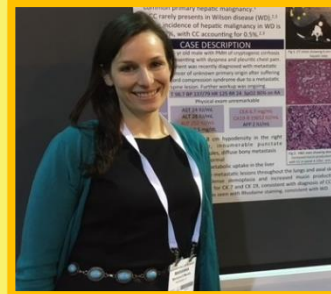

Sessions Designed With You In Mind

Financial Planning: The Facts and Fallacies of the Financial World and Disseminating Them

In this session, Financial Planner, Mike Chadwick, will speak about the facts and fallacies of financial planning. You will learn about the psychology of money, debt management and leave with the information you need to develop financial plan for your future. *Please note this session is not eligible for CME Credit.*

The Art of the Op Ed: How to Get Your Opinions Out into the World

Join physician and author Lisa Sanders, MD in this 2-hour session and learn the nature and structure of an op ed piece, how to develop a lead for an opinion piece and learn the basics of a pitch letter to get your op ed piece published.

Doctors Dilemma

In this session, teams of residents compete against each other in a test of their medical knowledge in this Jeopardy-style competition.
