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

It's 10 minutes after closing time, and kitchen workers are busy cleaning up an empty Greenwich Village restaurant. What remains of the day's menu has been dropped into tin trays that are stacked and waiting for pickup. Just a few years ago, the food that didn't make it into a \$10 lunch bowl would have been thrown away, trucked out of town and left to rot in a landfill. But these leftovers are headed to a different location: A volunteer grabs the trays, and the Brussels sprouts, leafy greens and farro begin a milelong trip down Canal Street before they arrive at a shelter.
