2018 Laureate Award Bradford Bergman, MD, FACP



Bradford Bergman, MD, FACP, is originally from Great Falls, MT. He received his BS with High Honors in Microbiology from the University of Montana in 1994. Dr. Bergman attended University of Washington School of Medicine, receiving his MD in 1998. He completed his internship and

residency at Internal Medicine Spokane in Spokane, Washington, in 2001. His internal medicine board certification was completed in 2001 and his recertification in 2011.
