The ASAM Treatment of Opioid Use Disorder Course is designed for:

- Physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, and health care team members working with patients with opioid use disorder.
- Physicians, nurse practitioners, and physician assistants who wish to obtain a waiver to prescribe buprenorphine for office-based treatment of opioid use disorders.

Our case-based learning format will show you how to apply this new knowledge.

You will learn how to:

- Offer treatments for patients with opioid use disorder.
- Identify and assess patients who are appropriate for treatment with medications.
- Discuss the psychiatric and medical comorbidities associated with opioid addiction.
- Apply for a waiver to prescribe buprenorphine to patients with opioid use disorders.

This training satisfies eight hours of education requirements for providers to qualify for a DEA DATA2000 waiver. Upon completion of this course, physicians qualify for the waiver to prescribe buprenorphine in an office-based setting. NPs and PAs can qualify after completing an additional 16 hours provided by ASAM, the American Association of Nurse Practitioners, and the American Academy of PAs.
