



**Do You Need Health Coverage? Resources are available to help Connecticut residents find and enroll in health insurance.**

If you need health insurance, you may be able to purchase it through the health insurance marketplace. Even if you are young and healthy, it is important that you get health insurance. Health insurance gives you the peace of mind of knowing that you will be covered and be able to afford your medical expenses if you have an accident or get sick. Depending on your income, family size, and a few other factors, you may qualify for financial assistance that will lower your premium and cost sharing.

**Resources for Patients:**

**Find help online:** Open enrollment in the health insurance marketplace begins on November 1, 2021 and ends on January 15, 2022. Individuals who have a qualifying life event (such as the birth of a child, marriage, divorce, or employment change) or were unable to enroll in the marketplace during open enrollment due to certain complex situations (such as an enrollment website error) may be granted a special enrollment period. Those who are eligible for Medicaid may enroll at any time throughout the year.
