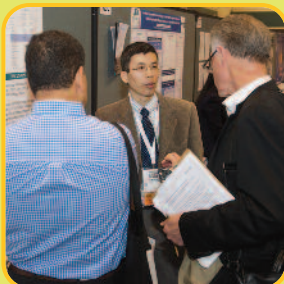

Special Guest Presenters

We are pleased this year to have two esteemed guest presenters, in honor of the College's Centennial year: Dr. Timothy Quill and the Honorable Michelle Lujan Grisham.

Dr. Timothy Quill has published and lectured widely about various aspects of the doctor-patient relationship, with special focus on end-of-life decision making, including delivering bad news, non-abandonment, discussing palliative care earlier, and exploring last-resort options. He is the author of several books on end-of-life and numerous articles published in major medical journals. Dr. Quill is a Professor of Medicine, Psychiatry, and Medical Humanities at the University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry and also the Director of the Center for Ethics, Humanities and Palliative Care.

The Honorable Michelle Lujan Grisham is the United States Representative for New Mexico's First District. A native New Mexican, she has served as Secretary of the State Agency on Aging, Secretary of the New Mexico Department of Health, and as Bernalillo County Commissioner. She was elected to the 113th Congress in November 2012, and presently serves on the House Committee on Agriculture, the House Committee on the Budget and the House Committee on Oversight and Government Reform.
