Submissions accepted only by e-mail and digital photograph or PDF of artwork or poetry. Further details and entry rules will be forthcoming through chapter e-mails.

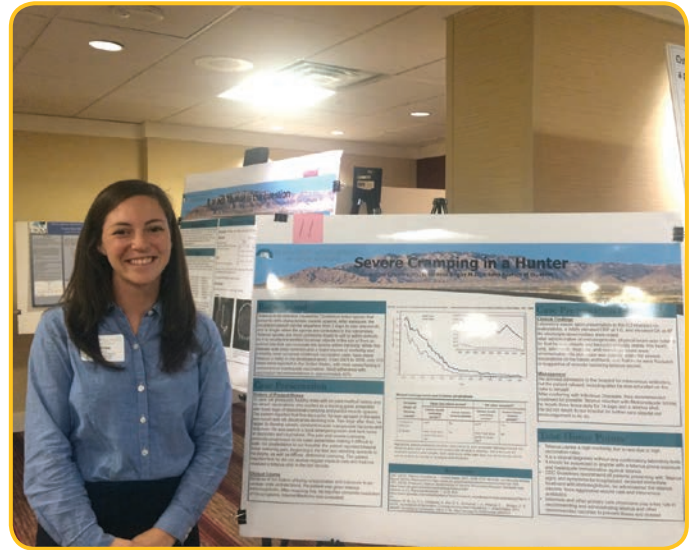
